Over 12,000 people attended this year's festival with many more watching the fireworks from surrounding neighborhoods. The night was complete when the brewery whistle blew once again in the valley and the Thunder Valley Fireworks Show delighted spectators. The fireworks display is the biggest and best show that south sound residents see all year - and this year's show was without a doubt the best ever! The event would not be possible without the nearly 100 volunteers who donate their time and effort to make the 4th of July a success. 
Community Involvement







- Large Group/Public Events: For all events larger than 100 people and/or open to the public, a special event permit application must be completed and approved. No person shall use a city park for a public event without a special event permit.

Cancellations:

- Reservation fees are refundable minus a \$10 cancellation fee.
- Cancellations must be made at least 14 days prior to the reservation to be eligible for a refund.
- Cancellations are not available through the online registration system; they must be requested by contacting office staff.
- No refunds will be made due to inclement weather.
